TWO-YEAR HIGHER SECONDARY PROGRAMME

1. Scheme Of Studies

The academic aspects of the two-year Higher Secondary Programme are governed by the rules and regulations of the Assam State School Education Board (ASSEB Div-II), Bamunimaidam, Guwahati erstwhile Higher Secondary Education Council. The Programme is split into two years with two year-end examinations. As per the latest arrangements HS Final Year Examinations are conducted by the ASSEB Div-II while HS First Year Examinations are jointly conducted by the College and District Level Internal Examination Committee (DLIEC, Div-II), as per instructions and guideline of ASSEB, Guwahati.

2. Eligibility For Admission

A student seeking admission to HS First Year classes in the academic session 2026-27 should have cleared the HSLC Examination under ASSEB or any other equivalent examination recognised by competent authorities. Besides, the student has to comply with all norms as set by the Cachar College Admission Committee from time to time. Except the cases of reservation and official quota merit is the only criterion for admission. Students passing out the HS First Year Examination are eligible for automatic admission to HS Final Year Classes.

As per Govt. rules seats are reserved for SC/ST/OBC/MOBC/PWD and some other notified categories of candidates.

The Scheme of Study for Secondary stage (Class XI & XII)

(As per ASSEB Div-II Notification No. ASSEB/Div-II/Course Curricula/2025/007/558 Dated 24.04.2025)

- There will be 6 compulsory subjects in total for all students.
- Subjects to be taken in each stream are divided in groups namely A, B, & C.
- A student shall opt for the Core subjects listed under part A and Elective subjects listed in Part B & C as specified.
- Each student has to opt for 4[Four] elective subjects compulsorily. These elective subjects will be of 100 marks, may be with practical or without practical.
- In addition to the 4[Four] elective subjects, a candidate shall have to compulsorily study Environmental Education in Class XI and General Studies in Class XII. The assessment of the subjects will be done internally by the institution where studying and Grade will be awarded.

Criteria for adopting Subjects:

Arts Stream - English and MIL/Alt.Eng compulsory, Maximum 3 subjects from Group B, one subject from Group C is compulsory to opt.

Class XI - Environment Education and In class XII - General Studies as 7th paper.

9. Admission Procedure

- A candidate has to apply for admission in HS First Year through "DARPAN" portal (<https://studentcorner.darpan.ahseconline.in/login>).
- The published Selection list and Waiting list for admission into HS First Year will be made available in the DARPAN portal for the students. The students will be notified of their selection through SMS.
- After publication of the Selection list, students are advised to accept the offer of admission from Cachar College using their login id in the portal at the earliest.
- Student must take admission in the college within the stipulated time period by paying the admission fees online in the Cachar College admission portal to complete the admission process.

COLLEGE UNIFORM

Wearing college uniform is compulsory for all across religion and custom failing which a student will not be allowed to enter the College campus during college hours. It is also mandatory for students to keep identity card along with them.

INTERNAL DISCIPLINE

The College has always kept a high standard of internal discipline for students in the interest of conducive academic environment. To honour the time tested heritage of the College, students are advised to comply with the following guidelines.

- 1. Ragging in all form is banned in this college. This institution is committed to follow the anti- ragging circular of the UGC in letter and spirit. Students are accordingly warned against all types of ragging activities which are treated as cognizable offences.**
2. Entry to the College Campus is permitted only when a student is in College Uniform and in possession of the Identity Card. The guard posted at the College Gate is instructed accordingly. Students are only expected to cooperate with him in the proper discharge of his duty.
3. Irregularity in classes (both theory and practical) is viewed seriously by the College authority. Taking both the Unit Tests and the Test Examination/Half Yearly Examination is mandatory for all. In fact, students are sent up for final examination on the basis of their performances in the internal examinations and class attendance.
4. Keeping the College building and furniture clean and intact is the duty of the students. Writing/sticking bills, posters on the walls, splitting and littering shall be treated as breach of discipline.
5. The Principal is accessible to the individual student as per the official schedule only. Entry of students in a body in the Principal's Chamber is strictly prohibited.
